

Walter Eastens

Signaller in the Border Regiment Killed in action 10th April
1918 remembered at Ploegsteert Memorial in Belgium

The report from the Warrington Guardian dated 8th of June 1918 states that Walter was reported missing and wounded on the 9th of April 1918 and died the following day. He resided at 114 New Chester Road, Warrington and was educated at Arpley Street School and employed in 1915 at Messrs Fletcher, Russell & Co. Walter was a keen sportsman and took a great interest in boxing. His brother was Private Albert Eastens in the Royal Flying Corp Yorkshire.
